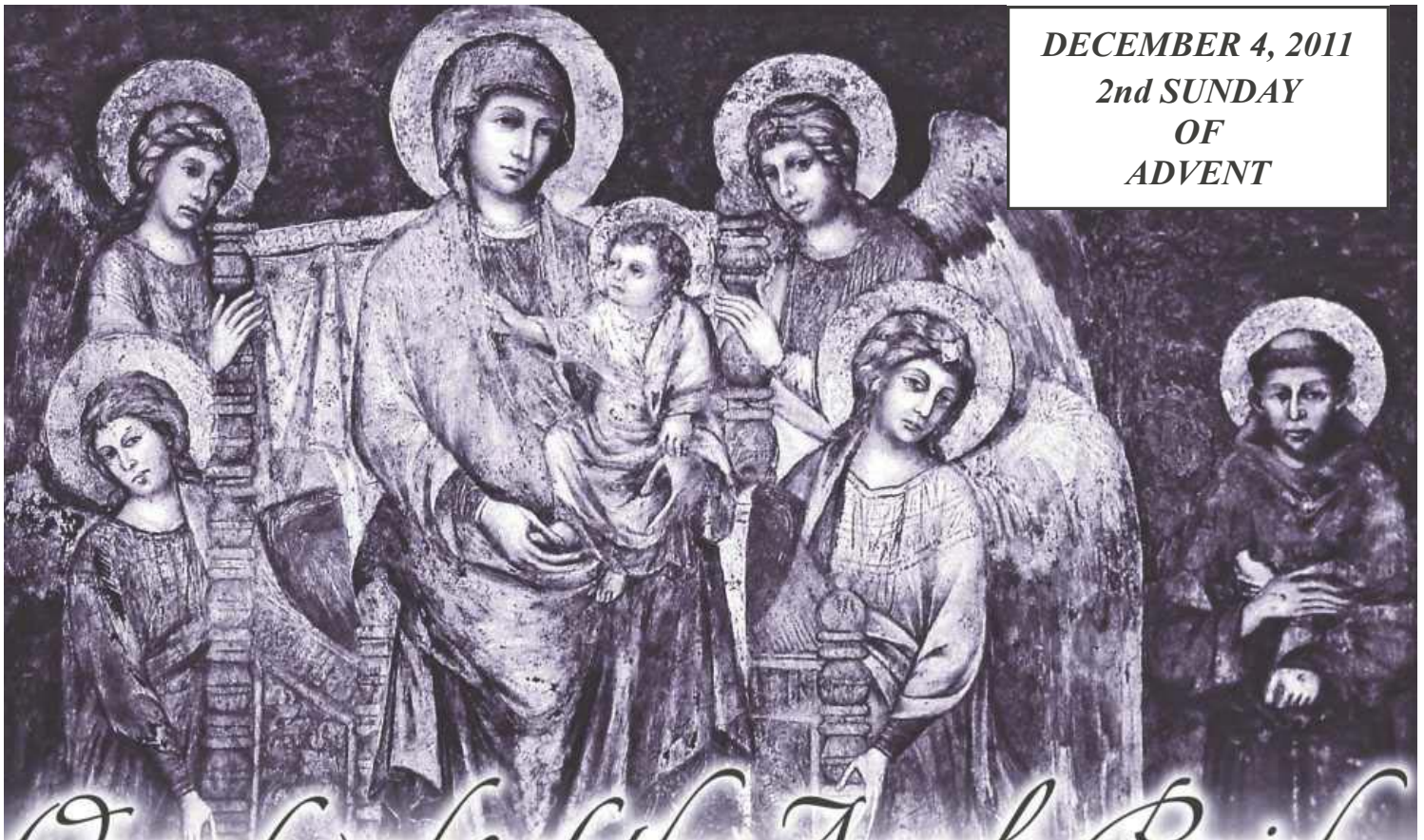

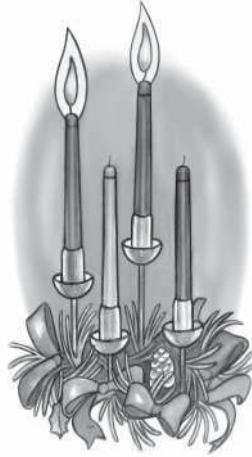

## FAITHFUL LIVING

In most large cities, and often in smaller towns, you'll see young folks on bikes with helmets on their heads driving between the trucks, buses and numerous cabs, cars and motorcycles. They often ignore traffic lights. They ply their way through the minutest slice of pavement to arrive as quickly as inhumanly possible to their destination. These often independent "messenger" services are as much a part of city-life as nearly all the fast-paced activities we might see. Speed is the key to success in the "messenger" business...and being trustworthy. Companies put vital projects, personal papers and records in the hands of these delivery guys and girls. They pay not an inexpensive rate and expect perfect performance. Reputations and financial success are at stake, so these people have to do their jobs flawlessly, or lives could be damaged. When we think of the Post Office, UPS and Fed-Ex, for example, we are entrusting them with the same kind of responsibility. From gifts, to products, love notes to mortgage payments are entrusted to people we don't really know, and even though we pay high prices for their services, we ultimately are entrusting these companies with some very important, often very personal, material. Impressively, for the most part, we are served pretty well indeed. But, we also know, things get waylaid and damaged and even lost. (If you saw Tom Hanks in "Castaway" you'll recall just how lost our things can get!) It is not an accident that for some things that we might send through these companies they offer us a chance to buy insurance, so that we can recoup what might be lost...at least financially, if it is lost, damaged or stolen.



This came to mind, weirdly enough, when I thought of our Gospel passage today introducing us to the ministry of St. John the Baptist, the great "messenger of the coming of the Messiah!" John too was given by God a remarkable mission: to "prepare the way of the Lord" by calling people to repentance of their sins and preparing them to receive the Savior, who would be coming to them very soon. John's work was to help people do the work they needed to do to make ready for the Lord to be received by them. In John's day, when a Roman general or a political figure would be coming to a city, the leaders of the town or village would make sure that the roads were cleared of stones, ruts, fallen branches or any obstructions so as to provide the visitor with a smooth entry into the place they were going to. In a sense, Advent is like that: preparing the road or path that leads to our hearts, clearing away "spiritual debris", i.e. bad habits, self-centeredness, greed, bigotry, spiritual indifference and allowing Jesus to travel easily to the place in each one of us that He wants to call "home"! In this way, through listening to His word, prayer and renewing our minds and

hearts, we not only become dwelling places for the Lord, we become witnesses and messengers of the "good news" that Emmanuel, which means "God is with His people", has come! It is by living faithful lives, true to the lives we've each have been given, true to the Lord we've each have been dedicated to at our Baptisms, that makes us *messengers of the good news!* We don't need paneled trucks or even bicycles to accomplish this. Even speed isn't the crucial issue! Trustworthiness and having a heart filled with Jesus...filled with love...this is the mark of a real *messenger!* May this be a blessed Advent for us and may each one of us "prepare the way of the Lord" in our own unique and very personal way! Come, Lord Jesus! Come!

## PASTOR'S COMMENTS....

I thought the new responses at Mass went fairly well last weekend. It will be important that everyone remain patient and also that you take up the cards each week until we have the responses memorized. As you could see last weekend Bro. Mike and I have the greater challenge since the majority of the changes are found in what we pray in leading the assembly. Please do not remove the Cards from the pews so that we have them for use each weekend.

The generosity of so many of our parishioners toward those in need over the Thanksgiving week was outstanding. There was a great outpouring of food and toiletries donated both last weekend and on Thanksgiving Day and the collection envelopes in support of ministry to the needy took in \$1,280.00. All the food and toiletries go to our Food Pantry and the monies donated through the envelopes is divided up between the Food Pantry and the St. Vincent de Paul Society to assist those in our neighborhood.

You may have noticed that the Stations of the Cross have been removed from church and are in the process of being restored. The hope is to have them returned to the church walls by February 22<sup>nd</sup> when the Season of Lent begins.

The Repairing the Bell Tower Fund has now reached \$19,788 in donations and the plans for the big March 10<sup>th</sup> Fundraiser continue to move forward. Tickets for the event, that will take place at Engine House #25, go on sale this week through Showlix Tickets. The cost is \$100.00 per ticket and there will be just 150 tickets for sale.
