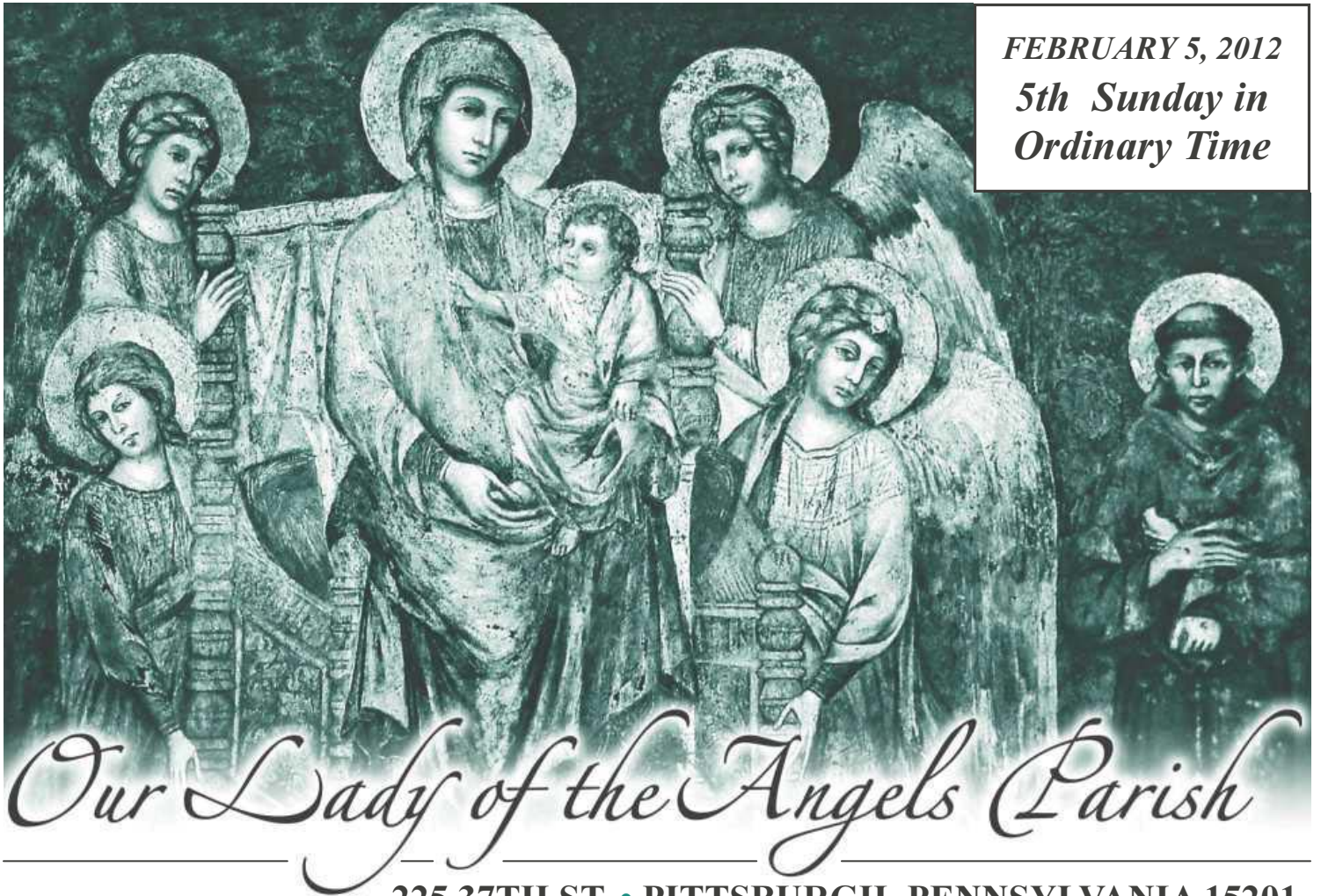

**PASTOR'S COMMENTS...**

There was a song in the 60's that had the refrain: "What's it all about Alfie, is it just for the moment we live"? In some ways that seems to be the question raised by the Scripture readings today. We read of Job in his experience of loss seeking an answer to the question of meaning. St. Paul seems to answer the question by saying: "I have made myself a slave to all so as to win over as many as possible." And Jesus tackles illness and possession head on and cures many while taking time to discern what it is that his mission is calling him to do.

In the end Job, Paul and Jesus all reach the conclusion that the meaning of life does not have an easy answer, but the answer they each struggle to embrace is that meaning comes from serving the will of God and always being faithful to who God has made them to be. This conclusion is reflected in a concrete way as we hear how Jesus responds to the disciples' interceding for Peter's mother-in-law, who is suffering from a fever. St Mark writes: "Jesus grasped her hand, and helped her up" – He "raised her up". Having experienced God's power of healing in her life, Peter's mother-in-law's response is that "she waited on them" – she became a disciple of service and compassion. It seems that this is the deeper meaning of life conveyed by the living Word of God – we are sustained by the power of God to be disciples of His service and compassion.

As most of you are aware that the opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration is offered every Wednesday from 9am – 4pm in our Parish House Chapel. I have noticed that the number of folks coming during the adoration time is not very consistent and there are times that there is no one in the Chapel. When the Eucharistic Lord is placed in the Monstrance for adoration there should be someone in Chapel throughout the adoration time. The primary times that are unattended are from 1 – 4pm. Please considering coming for Adoration during that time.

I invite you to check out the final seven winners of our Lottery. Thank you to all those who sold and/or bought tickets and made the Lottery such a success! A number of folks asked about when we would be offering another Lottery so we are planning to run the Lottery again in June. The Lottery Tickets will go one sale in late March, so stay tuned.
