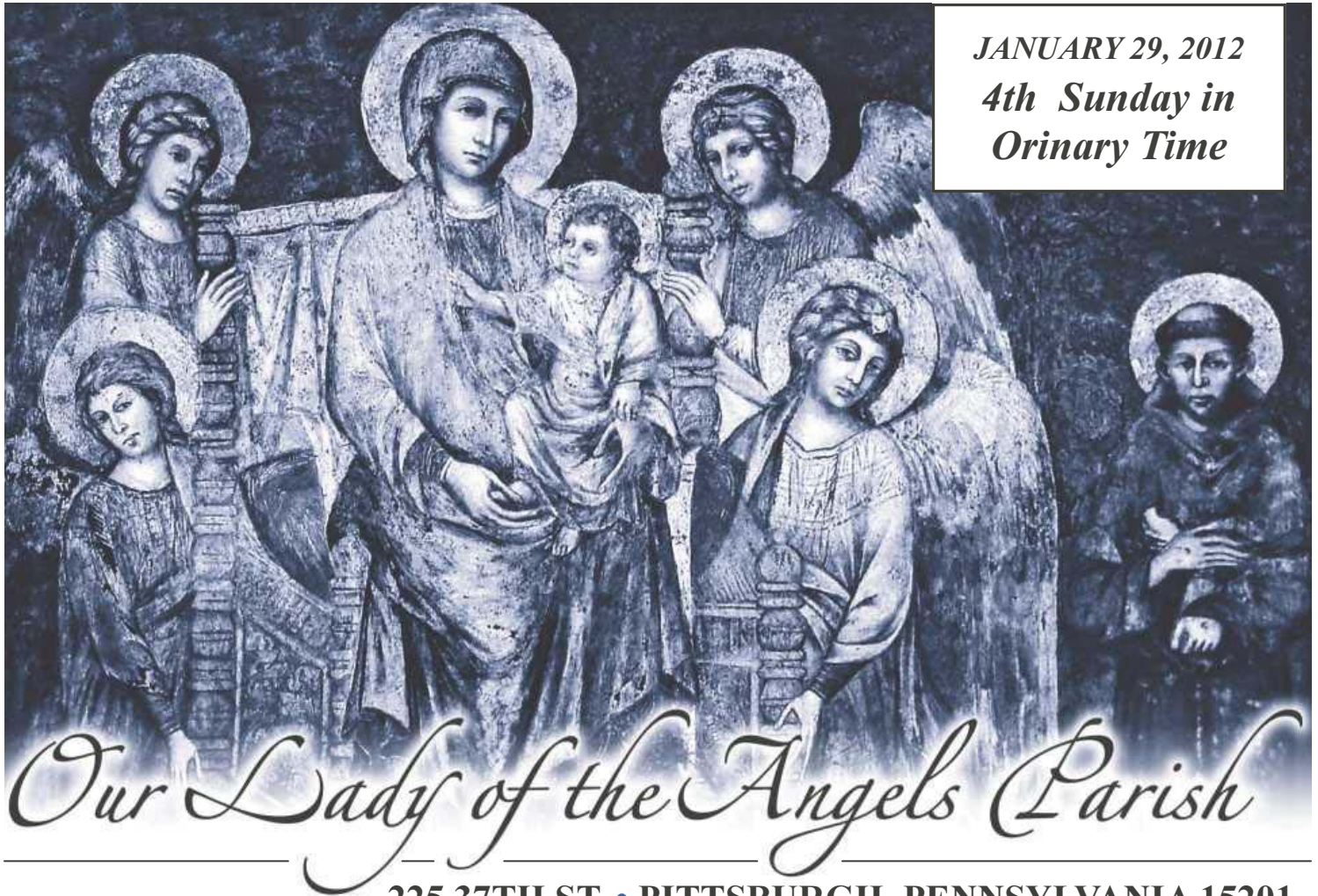

LISTEN EASY....

YOU CAN HEAR GOD CALLING...

How often are you moved by powerful or eloquent speakers? Loads of people are so moved by certain politicians or T.V. preachers that many have given over not only loads of cash, but their personal freedom and critical thinking to follow wherever they are lead. I know, in my lifetime, I have been inspired by very few political people, and not too many preachers, T.V. or otherwise. When I was young I enjoyed hearing President Kennedy speak. And as far as preachers, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen and Pope John Paul II, and my former pastor Msgr. Charles Owen Rice, and Msgr. Donald Kraus, who was seminary rector when I went to St. Paul Seminary, these guys moved me and yet were deeply humble in their way, and loving towards people in their real needs. Sometimes Billy Graham was impressive in his sincerity and faith. Perhaps you can think of a few inspirational people from your past... The key for discerning whether these folks are for real and not phony guides is rooted both in an intense love for God, love and compassion for others, and certainly humility. As we hear in Mark 1:21-28, our blessed Lord speaks with authority, with power, with total trust in the Father, and when He speaks, people listen... even demons listen, and flee! His power is exercised for people's good! He is not aggrandizing Himself, though as God, He certainly could if He wished, but He never does. Jesus only reminds us that "the Son of Man must suffer and lay down His life!" Authority and self-giving speak of authenticity!

As we draw near to the Pennsylvania Primary and national elections later this year, listen carefully and easily, to what you hear. Words can sound good but be filled with trickery and self-serving interests and are not for people's good. Speaking honestly and clearly about values is vital...listening with your Catholic values in mind is crucial for good discernment as we choose leaders for ourselves. Wisdom, understanding, love of the country and genuine humility before God are good indicators. Imprecision, foggy ideas, clever but insincere words are used by deceivers to manipulate the populace. Don't buy that bill of goods! Pray and ask the Lord to make it clear in your mind and heart as you honestly strive to seek truth, values that ring true and servants and not manipulators who will be genuine guides to society and witnesses to the world about what freedom means and entails. "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country!" After all of these years, these words

of President Kennedy still ring true and have inspired countless millions since January 20, 1961.

When I consider the message of the Gospel this week I ask myself, what kind of trust do I have in God's word, as Jesus taught it, so as to continue living my Christian life? Have I allowed this "Word" to guide my actions and decisions? Do I love God and His people, my people, more? And am I allowing myself to be disciplined by this word to really become a better man, religious, priest, son, brother and friend? Is my will, my plans, my heart really striving to conform myself to the Will of God for me, or am I allow my tiny rebellions and lack of trust at times to form my life? How about you? What guides you and directs your thoughts, words and deeds?

Pray my brothers and sisters that God's holy and loving "Word" can touch our minds and our hearts as we walk as witnesses to Jesus Christ, our Savior and the Lord of our lives! Strive to be happy as His friend and nothing will take your joy away! "Seek first the Kingdom"...everything else God provides!
